
I am writing as the past Director of the Innocence Project of Osgoode Hall Law School., a clinical program that involves law students in cases on wrongful conviction.

In my capacity as director I became familiar with Mr. Warren's situation as someone who may well have been wrongly convicted. Our review of the case is not complete, but on the evidence that is readily available it appears that there were fundamental problems with his trial. Much of the evidence relied on would today be excluded given what is now known about the causes of wrongful convictions. I have every expectation that a full review of this case will result in some remedy for Mr. Warren. To add to my opinion, it is significant that his case is now being investigated by the Association in Defence of the Wrongly Convicted (AIDWYC).

This can be a slow process, however, and in the meantime Mr. Warren has been granted day parole - perhaps in part a recognition of his situation. The recent psychological report, his prison record, and the injustice he appears to have suffered all combine to make him most deserving of community support and assistance. I hope you can help him with suitable accommodation.
